Brother Hector Aponte's comments resonated with recognition for all, of a job Well Done, that his degree made a lasting impression on him, and I am sure on a lot of us as well.


Many thanks to WB Jack Frost for being the Worshipful Master for the degree. Thank you to all the Brethren and visitors for making is spectacular.

#### **CHAPLAIN'S CORNER**

#### SPECULATIVE MASONRY

The extensive vision and description of the Masonic Doctrine based in the symbols, has been defined and interpreted in different forms. Recent publication "Contemplative Masonry" of brother C.R. Dunning, Jr., describe the contemplative thinking which is synonymous of meditation, which permit the focus of the conscious to internalize and understand the Masonic principles better.

At this time we present a small part of this interesting book related to the definition of Speculative Thinking.

#### SPECULATIVE THINKING

Our tradition teaches that we are engaged in Speculative Masonry rather than Operative Masonry. While we have ritual instructions on this distinction, it is also worthwhile to simple consider the meaning of "speculative". To be a speculative is to ask and try to answer questions such as these:

- What might a particular thing symbolize or mean other than what is superficially or literally apparent?
- If we consider something to have a particular meaning or explanation, how might that affect the possible meanings or explanations of other things?
- Where are the gaps in our explanations, knowledge, and understanding, and what possibilities might fill in the gaps?
- What other explanations are possible for the way things are?

Our tradition illustrates that for centuries, Speculative Mason have applied these kinds of question to the tools, methods, and customs of stonemasonry. Our ritual clearly engages this process by regarding almost everything we experience or do in the lodge as emblematic, symbolic, or allegorical of something related to virtuous and moral living. Masonic esotericism does not assume that all the speculative thinking in Masonry has already been done for us by the early ritualist, or that our only duties are to learn and perpetuate what they found. In fact, the ritual and monitorial instructions of many jurisdictions encourage us to always seek more light, Masonic esotericism therefore takes the ritual's explanations as a common foundation while also answering its call to attain new insight, understanding.


