

VIEW FROM THE WEST

It is not easy to cut stones to perfect sizes and shapes. It requires a lot of experience that only true artisans have. In history, only large buildings were made of ashlars. Other buildings were constructed with brick and wood. It was difficult to assemble skilled artisans that knew how to lay foundation stones, lay stones the right way on top of one

another for tall buildings, and build stone archways. It was also difficult to find artisans that could sculpt the stones into nice ornamental shapes.

There are two forms of ashlars in Freemasonry. Rough and Perfect ashlars. These stones serve to symbolize a man's spiritual and moral life. In Speculative Freemasonry, a Rough Ashlar represents an uninitiated Mason before he becomes enlightened. A man can improve his moral and spiritual being by education and acquisition of knowledge. A Rough Ashlar begins as an imperfect stone. A man is also imperfect initially. The Rough Ashlar represents the unrefined state of a man and the need for the man to be improved. The unrefined man learns that he could become a better man through better conduct and better spirituality of thought. He is charged to become a better person through obligations, expectations, and duties.

A Perfect Ashlar represents a Mason that works to achieve a purposeful, principled, righteous life and does all he can to be enlightened through brotherly love, cultivation and education. He transforms into a being that has been tried by the square of virtue, and he has become encircled by the compasses of his boundaries given to him by the Creator. A Mason continually smooths his external and internal rough edges to become a better man and a better Mason. Once a man has smoothed his ashlar to his best, he starts to help his Brothers to become better people and better Masons.

All Rough ashlars have the potential to become Perfect ashlars. First, the Rough Ashlar must be made of solid materials and their character flaws must be minimal. They must be receptive to change, and they must be capable of being worked into a perfect stone. In line with this, candidates for each Masonic degree are asked a lot of questions to know more about their characters and their qualifications. Candidates must have the capability to serve and support the Lodge. Candidates must be carefully inspected to certify that they can fit into our Masonic goals and tenets.

An Imperfect Ashlar can be made perfect, but some major flaws are difficult to change; these flaws can weaken a structure when the ashlar is

fitted into the structure. Masonry is a noble and ancient Brotherhood with a long history. A Flawed Ashlar can bring in negative thoughts, reproach, and embarrassment to the Brotherhood from non-Masons. Therefore, flawed ashlars cannot be allowed to join the Brotherhood.

We must also understand that Perfect ashlars cannot just be found in the stone quarries. They must be hammered, chiseled, and polished before they can attain their perfect state. It is hard to find 'perfect men' that exist without Brotherly light, guidance, and love. It is hard to find Masons that have not been in the state of Rough and Perfect ashlars at some point in their lives.

How can Masons contribute to the making of other Perfect ashlars? By seriously considering their personal responsibility to educate other Brothers towards their improvement. We get enlightened when we assist those in need. Master Masons uphold the tenets of the craft and teach other Brothers what they have learned. All Lodges must take time in judging the potential of a candidate. They must weigh their characters and evaluate their potential for change. All Masons must extend a friendly hand of affection and love, to help new Masons become better people. We must help the new Masons to stand upright with the plumb, live on the square, and become true Masons who will make the Creator proud of them.


All worthy men must take the lesson of the Rough and Perfect Ashlar seriously. We must take these lessons seriously so that we can become more knowledgeable and less ignorant, go from death to life and go from darkness to light.

Brothers from Yuma Lodge #17 participated in their Highway Cleanup in October, making sure a section of Highway 95 continues to look beautiful!






























- The applicant must return the completed application to you with required documents no later than <u>April 1, 2020.</u>
- You, as Lodge Secretary, must send the completed Scholarship Packet to me not later than May 1, 2020.
- 3. Determination of scholarship recipients will be after Grand Lodge in mid-July.

May I suggest the following as a story to run in your Trestle board or Email, as it is a primary means to inform the brethren of the scholarships:

Applications for 2020 – 2021 Grand Lodge scholarships are now available from (Lodge Secretary's name), announces Worshipful Master (Master's name).

The deadline for completing the application – along with other required documents – is April 1, 2020. The completed application and other documents are to be submitted to the Lodge Secretary by that date.

Applications will be reviewed, forwarded to the Grand Lodge Scholarship Committee, which will consider the applications and notify the successful recipients in mid-July of 2020.

Applicants must meet one of the following criteria: be the son, daughter, grandson, of granddaughter of an Arizona Master Mason, or be an Arizona member (or and Arizona senior/majority member) of DeMolay, Rainbow for Girls or Job's Daughters. The applicant must use the scholarship monies to attend a school of higher learning within the State of Arizona, unless the major course or discipline of study is not offered within the State of Arizona. Then and only then, can the scholarship monies be used toward attendance of an out-of-state institution of higher learning. Must be a full time student in an undergraduate program (carry and complete a minimum of 12 semester hours).

Inasmuch as considerable work must be done by applicants to complete the application and compile the necessary documents, it is urged that applicants not delay in doing the necessary paperwork. (I will email you this notice if you request at (jackeb&@msn.com).

Scholarship Rules and Additional Instructions

- The applicant must be an Arizona resident.
- 2. The applicants must meet one of the following criteria: be the son, daughter, grandson, or granddaughter of an Arizona Master Mason, or be an Arizona member (or an Arizona senior/majority member) of DeMolay, Rainbow for Girls or Job's Daughters.
- 3. The applicant must use the scholarship monies to attend a school of higher learning within the State of Arizona, unless the major course or discipline of study is not offered within the State of Arizona. Then, and only then, can the scholarship monies be used toward attendance of an out-of-state institution of higher learning. Must be a full time student in an undergraduate program (carry and complete a minimum of 12 semester hours).
- 4. The applicant should read and fill out the reverse side of this form. It should be done with care, forethought and neatness. The applicant should remember the impression he/she is giving the committee. Be concise and accurate in all answers, but be sure to give all the information requested. If there are any extenuating circumstances in any area, be specific and state them.
- 5. After completing the form, sign it, and attach it to the form with all other requested information and see that it is delivered to your local Masonic Blue Lodge Secretary by **April 1, 2020**.
- The Lodge Secretary will verify that the form is completely filled out and that the requested information is attached. He also will validate Rule 2 above.
- 7. The Lodge Secretary will then sign this side of the form, signifying that their Lodge is your sponsor.
- The Lodge Secretary will then mail your "Scholarship Packet" to the Chairman of the Grand Lodge Scholarship Committee by May 1, 2020. The current chairman is Jack Bender, 16116 E. Glendora Dr., Fountain Hills AZ 85268, Email: jackeb8@msn.com
- 9. The Committee will review the applications, and successful applicants will be notified in mid-July.
- 10. The new Grand Lodge Scholars may be asked to participate in a Masonic Recognition Program honoring them. If there are any questions about this, the successful applicant should discuss it with the Lodge Secretary or Scholarship Chairman.
- 11. Application packets are not returned but may be given to other Masonic groups who have Scholarship programs.
- 12. One half of the scholarship is awarded for the Fall Semester. The other half of the scholarship will be mailed after the Scholarship Committee Chairman receives the Grand Lodge Scholar's first semester grades. Grand Lodge Scholars are expected to have a first semester grade point average of 2.50, complete at least 12 hours, and be registered for at least 12 credit hours for the Spring Semester in order for the remainder of the scholarship to be awarded.
- 13. Applicants may apply every year, as each year is independent of the preceding year.

NOTE: Brother Secretary, your signature acknowledges that your Lodge is sponsoring this applicant and that you have read Rules 6, 7 and 8 above.
