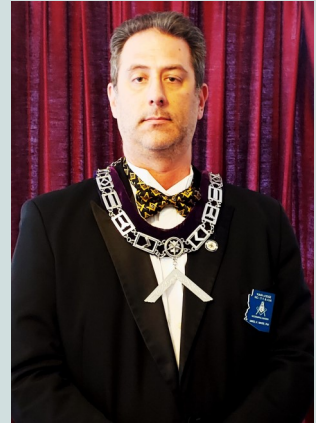
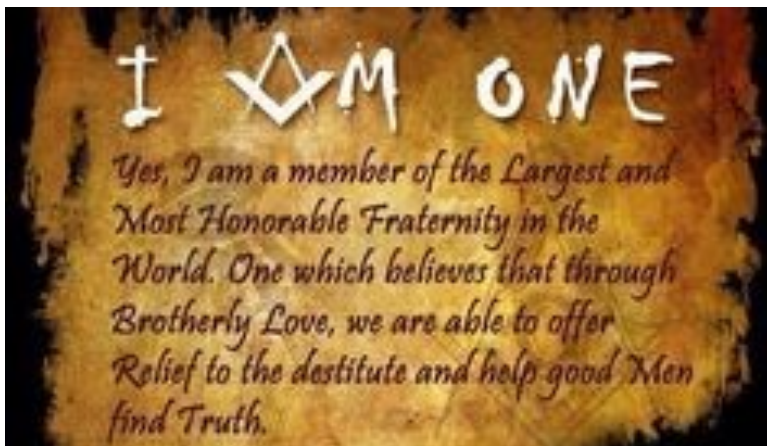

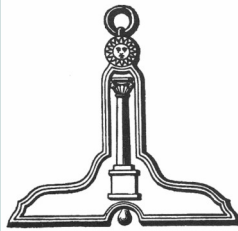

VIEW FROM THE WEST

Hello Brothers,

Your Senior Warden here currently in Puerto Rico visiting some family. I thought I would get some knowledge about Freemasonry and pass it along to you.

"The Masonic history in Puerto Rico begins in the year 1803, however, these lodges answered to different foreign Grand Lodges, like those in France, Spain, Cuba, Santo Domingo, and even Pennsylvania, USA. The first known Lodge that existed Puerto Rico was called '*Restauración*', and it was founded in 1811 in Mayagüez, Puerto Rico. This Lodge was created with the help of the Grand Lodge Unida de Colón, Cuba. This Grand Lodge and the one from Puerto Rico were under the Spanish domain, the Grand Orient of Spain. In 1863, the Grand Lodge of Venezuela founded the Lodge Boriquén #57 after Puerto Rico had contact with South America, which was done after France temporarily took the island as a colony. However, even after all these, the most solid Masonic Lodge in Puerto Rico was called Unión Germana, which was founded in San Germán, Puerto Rico. This Lodge was founded under order of the Grand Lodge of Santo Domingo."

"After Puerto Rico had its first provincial Lodge in 1884, the Grand Lodge of Colón, Cuba let Puerto Rico found its own Grand Lodge, which is known as the Grand Lodge Soberana of Free and Accepted Mason in 1885. Though the Grand Lodge was founded first at Mayagüez, the Lodge was relocated to San Juan, which is the capital of Puerto Rico. At first, there were 14 Lodges active at that time, but of those 14 lodges, only 7 still remain active today. Those remaining Lodges are: Adelfia #1 at Mayagüez; Tanamá #2 at Arecibo; Estrella de Luquillo #5 at San Juan; Aurora #7 at Ponce; Unión #10 at Guayama; San Juan Bautista #12 at San Juan; and Iris de Paz #13 at Arroyo. The Most Worshipful Brother Santiago Palmer (1844-1908) was the first Grand Master in Puerto Rico, who was once held prisoner at El Morro as Freemasonry was persecuted by the Spanish regime."

"The Scottish Rite in Puerto Rico received its license by the USA Scottish Rite-Southern Jurisdiction in 1903. However, the York Rite reached Puerto Rico in 1903 after the USA invasion that happened in 1898 with only the Capitular Degrees. The Cryptic Degrees were instituted in 1907 and the Chivalric degrees in 1977. There are 68 known Scottish Rite Lodges, while there is only one York Rite lodge. There are also Shriner Order and the Order of the Eastern Star."

Information for the upcoming Masonicon 2021 has been published and many of the line officers have already registered. Hope to see you there.

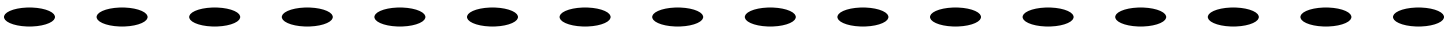
Degree work is starting to come together and our new Masons are eager to further themselves in Masonry.

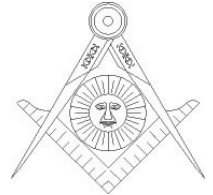

VERGIL MASON

INITIATION

Expression derived from the Latin “Initia” or also “Initiate”, which means the beginning of a science or creed.

MYSTERIES

It is the name by which religious assemblies whose ceremonies were practiced in secret were known in ancient times, their doctrines are taught only to the chosen, whose intellectual and moral qualities join a tremendously rigorous initiation.

On this occasion we present a fragment of Mark Booth's book “The Sacred History”, describing the initiation of the Great Roman Poet VERGIL.

My intention is to compare this ceremony with Masonic initiation in a future article.

Vergil was an initiate of the ancient schools. Reconstruction from the Aeneid and other scattered literary references show that after a long period of preparation which might have involved long periods of fasting, sensory deprivation, meditation, prolonged solitude, bathing in highly scented water that may have been drugged (the “Water of Forgetfulness” and “Waters of Memory”), the disoriented candidate for initiation would have been led by priests wearing masks into, it seemed, the very bowels of the Earth. The candidate witnessed a sacrifice, was dragged through small holes in a wall, propelled into pits and finally taken to an inner sanctum where they had an experience that was partly an experience of physical place and partly

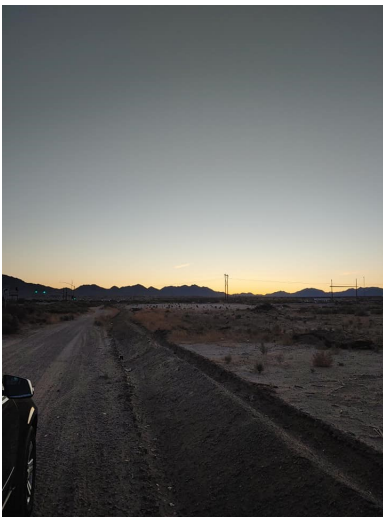

visionary an experience not totally unlike a modern séance but much more elaborate and conceived on a much larger scale. The candidate might spend days underground, typically three days, though Apollonius is reported to have spent seven, before being led upward again to the heavens.

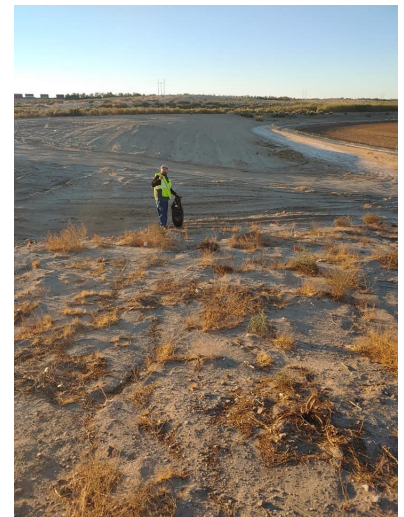
The great initiates of the ancient world describe this as a profoundly moving experience which fundamentally altered their understanding of the world.

Some people are born with a visionary consciousness. Others may be initiated into it by the ceremonies of secret societies. The techniques for inducing higher states of consciousness and contacting higher intelligence are among the most closely guarded secrets of the secret societies.

Several brothers participated in a Highway Cleanup on January 9th. Our section of Highway 95 is looking good!



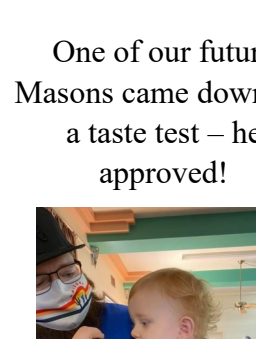

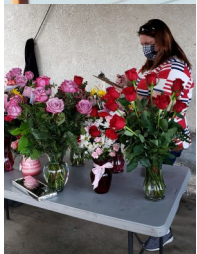
