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VIEW FROM THE WEST

An excerpt from "A New Encyclopedia of Freemasonry" by Arthur Edward Wait, P.M., P.Z.:

ACACIA

In so far as this Tree, which is connected with a memorable event in Masonic Legend, may be regarded

as a symbol of immortality, the notion may be referred to its extraordinary persistence, for Du Pratz says that if any of the bark be left on its branches they will take root if planted as posts. There are several species, among which the Acacia vera is called the Egyptian Thorn (otherwise Acacia seyal) and produces gum-Arabic. It is identified with the Shittah Tree and Shittim-Wood of Exodus and Isaiah. It was used in constructing the Ark of the Covenant and the Altar of the Tabernacle. Christian Legend tells us that the Crown of Thorns was made of its spiked twigs, and in the curious pseudo-historical account attached to the Grade of Novice and Knight of St. John the Evangelist, the wood of the Cross is said to have been of this tree. I do not know whence this fable derives, but perhaps o account of it Horace Walpole calls the Acacia "the genteelest tree of all," following the Elizabethan dramatist who terms Christ "the first true gentleman that ever breathed." The Burning Bush has been identified with Aqua nilotica, by a reflection from Rabbinical Tradition, which calls it simply a thorn-bush. The red and white blossoms were regarded as sacred in Egypt, and in one of the folk-tales ascribed to the nineteenth dynasty the hero is represented as placing his soul for safe-keeping within the petals of the top-most bloom growing in a Valley of Acacia. For Paracelsus it was a healing tree; he used it with other ingredients as a plaster for wounds and apparently to stop bleeding.

A Sign of Immortality – I have failed to trace any real connection with funeral rites, and it seems certain that there is no sense in which it can be called emblematic of burial. It belongs to the analogies of hope beyond and life continued henceforward: it is to this that the Master Mason testified, according to an old French Catechism, when in proof of his status he answered: "The Acacia is known to me." It has been said that it was consecrated to the sun in Arabia, but no evidence is offered. It has been identified also, though in an arbitrary manner, with the Golden Bough of Virgil; but this was evergreen oak. In the Third Symbolical (continued on page 6)



MUSINGS FROM THE DESK OF THE SENIOR GRAND WARDEN

IN HOC SIGNO VINCES KNIGHT TEMPLAR

Mastering the "Royal WE" by Steve Balke

It's seldom clear to us how we impact the people around us, the people following us, and even the "whole picture of the point of our work."

Even when it is clear, any insight gleaned is often limited by self-imposed or circumstantial constraints.

Freemasonry's symbolic and moral instruction harnesses this phenomenon: the candidate undergoes experience before receiving explanation. In the Royal Arch, we get the final lesson regarding our capacity for teamwork: when we three do agree, our individual strengths are enhanced when aligned with the strengths of others. In Council we are exposed to the observer's perspective. Decrypting, if you will, the value of differing perceptions, strengths, and experiences allows for intentional cooperation. The Royal Master degree gives us fundamental insights on the impact of personal effectiveness.

Are we proactive? Even when we think we understand the "overall picture" and have a goal in mind, circumstances beyond our control may interfere with our intentions. But action itself is valuable. Hiram's instruction during the circumambulations plainly states that we contribute to what comes before us, that the time we have is a precious – and finite – opportunity, and though we may not recognize the impact we have, actual understanding awaits us when we move on. Our ideas, work, and creations are valuable and should be acted upon. How they manifest through time is beyond us – the seed may yield fruit in time long after us.

Importantly, the question is put, do we exemplify a commitment to be and do our best? Whatever we do should be done whole heartedly. Our actions are not outcome dependent; they should spring from a desire to do right. This is true inspiration. The work is its own reward, as we say.

Depending on your ritual, the prologue to the Royal Master may focus on the bowl, an undefined object, or a three-tier candelabra, but each shows that Adoniram's activity and skill produced a result. Adoniram created something under direction for the sake of creation itself. In some cases, neither he nor Hiram (his "supervisor") knew the intended use of the object prior to its completion: The best example of our dedication is evidenced in labor.

Do we intend our work to complement the work of others? Effective education guides the student from the basics to the complex and illustrates how various skills and concepts interact to reveal the whole through the parts. The Biblical references and the lecture in the Royal Master reveal how each golden vessel was brought to the Holy of Holies, there placed around the Ark to properly incur the presence of God. When we intentionally focus our activities and efforts as part of a team, we complement each other and manifest a greater vision.

"In the event of an emergency, please ensure that your oxygen mask is working properly before assisting others." To effectively serve others, we must first prioritize what we're doing. The Royal Master takes us on a journey, depicting how working together is as important to the individual as it is to the whole. Like every Lodge, or really any other Masonic body or committee, among those who can best agree, our strengths resonate while our weaknesses cancel out.

The courses offered by the York Rite Leadership Program have been designed to augment the lessons of our ritual. The first courses are about personal effectiveness – they give you the tools and materials needed to be self-apprising, to move past old habits and acquire traits. The second courses provide methodologies to bridge any remaining gaps to teamworking. You create a plan that includes all team members, values input from others, and represents a common vision. Finally we help you refine your communication skills to realize team perspectives and goals. The whole team should feel satisfied – not only with the organization's accomplishment – but with their personal contribution, too.

VIEW FROM THE WEST (continued)

Grade, according to the classification adopted by the Masonic Order of Memphis, the Worshipful Master explains that "the Branch of Acacia...is an emblem of that ardent zeal for truth which should be cherished by every Master, encompassed as he is by corrupted men who betray it"; but this is a flimsy artifice, characteristic of the Rite which devised it and of the Masonic period in France to which it belonged at its origin. To sum up therefore, the emblem is a on the surface, funereal in that the great pagent with which it is connected



the emblem is – on the surface – funereal in that the great pageant with which it is connected is unquestionably one of resurrection. It appears to form part of a story which has a deeper meaning than is found on the surface.

The Hermetic Rose – From my own point of view as a mystic, it is a figurative representation of our inward nature, like the Hermetic Rose itself. As that Rose out of a rude mountain, so issues from the inchoate nature of the man of earth the many-petalled flower of spiritual being: so gradually and slowly unfold our potencies – like petals – from within. As the beautiful blossoms of the Acacia are put forth successively till the branch is covered and weighted down, so from one root and stock are the powers of our interior and centre manifested outwardly. As the life of the young Pelicans was sustained by the resources of the parent bird of the legend, so are our exterior forces fed from the spirit which is within; so from within is sustained the life of the outward man. And that which is interior is the larger part; our possibilities are greater than our attainments, but there are greater attainments to come; while the mystics tell us that he who is within is older than he who it without. On such a priori considerations, the Acacia typifies that which is immortal in our nature; when planted to signify the place of rest where lay that which was perishable it testified that the Master lived, and so also that which he denoted. The plans of the unfinished temple were not wanting but hidden; the Word was reserved somewhere and would be restored by time or circumstances; and after the shadowed lights of figurative resurrection, there would come the Orient light, the bright and Morningstar, heralding a resurrection in the spirit, in the real and imperishable man, full of grace and truth. The motto to be inscribed on the Acacia is therefore Resurgamus nos.

A Sign of Innocence – The Acacia in Greek is ή άκακία, and the same word signifies simplicity, innocence and the mind turning from evil, as if with instinctive horror. There are no pitfalls comparable to those which are dug for the unwary by mere intimations of words, and I question whether I should have mentioned this fact at all if it had not been cited by others, more especially as the innocence of the Master Builder was not a subject at issue when the Acacia was planted over his grave, any more than the legendary choice of shittim-wood for the cross erected on Calvary signified – in the opinion of those who crucified Christ – that He was the unspotted and stainless victim of the Supreme Sacrifice. It was the makers of the Hiramic myth who saw to it that a thing which was implied in their minds should be symbolized on the grave of their symbolic Master. They placed therefore a sign of resurrection and immortality, as if in some later mystery the grave should give up its dead in the fashion of one who henceforward would be alive for evermore. Meanwhile, in the person of their Candidate of the Third Degree, they indicated this implicit and shewed forth this mystery to come, as in a glass and darkly, making the darkness for the moment only more visible. As we know, however, the intention which I have ventured to predicate, on the expressed authority of all the Ancient Mysteries and on the transparent implicits of the Master Grade, came to nothing. But on the continent of Europe, in the holy places of Lyons, under the auspices of Martinism and the Strict Observance, there were those who had eyes for symbolism and they saw clearly. They saw to it also after their own speaking manner, and it came about therefor – before the end of the eighteenth century – that Hiram rose. I say therefore with Éliphas Lévi: "I also believe in the resurrection of Hiram." Meanwhile, those who are pleased to affirm that the Acacia is a symbol of innocence shall pass unchallenged, but the point is not of consequence to the subject. Could funerary connections be established ever so clearly, they would be of no consequence either, for the greatness of the Third Degree does not consist in the death or burial of the Master Builder but in the Raising of the Candidate. I observe that Dr. Frederick Dalcho, famous as a High Grade Mason in South Carolina, affirmed the connection in an Oration belonging to the year 1802, namely, that the ancient Jews were accustomed to place the Acacia over graves, not as a symbol of immortality – about which they knew but vaguely, and not as a sign of resurrection – about which at that time they knew nothing at all – but as a warning to their priests who were "prohibited from crossing a grave." The fact, if it be a fact, would signify less than nothing, for we are dealing with symbolism and not, as it happens, with signposts. I have checked the (continued on next page)



reference, however, and find that Dr. Dalcho was speaking of the matter as if it were common knowledge and cited no authority. It has been advanced also that Blount in his Levantine Travels includes the planting of evergreens on graves as a Jewish custom belonging to that region. Unfortunately, the Acacia is an evergreen, but all evergreens are not acacias. Moreover, on recourse to these curious old travels it proves that the custom in question is Turkish and not Jewish. The actual terms of the statement are: "They plant such kind of plants or flowers as remain green all the year." I shall remain content therefore with that which I have in evidence: a token of immortality is better than a graveyard warning, and a sign of resurrection shall be preferred before one of death.

FREE WILL

One of the greatest attributes of the human being is the ability to choose what he does or does not do, assuming responsibility for such actions. About Free Will, many interpretations have been given from different points of view, such as the Theological, Philosophical, and Scientific.

From the Theological point of view, Free Will is an attribute conferred by God on human beings. The great monotheistic religions of the West admit the influence of the Supreme Being, conferring on man the ability to exercise freedom of choice in the course of his existence, taking responsibility for their actions and earning himself the reward or punishment. (1)(2)

After the scientific revolution of the 17th Century, the mechanistic philosophy of the new science implied that the movements of matter are always determined by previous material circumstances. To the extent that human beings depend on their material bodies, it would seem logical to assume that all options are determined by circumstances beyond their own control, this is what is known as determinism. (1)

Given that this philosophical conception did not give a sufficient explanation, most modern philosophers have tried to defend Free Will starting from other points of view. The so-called Liberals agree with Spinoza that determinism leaves no room for Free Will and deny that human beings are determined. Others, such as the so-called compatibilists, accept that human options are determined, but deny that this rules out human Free Will.

In recent times, explanations such as Quantum Physics have emerged whose probabilistic foundation seems to support the favorable view of Free Will. (1) There are those who support the influence of genetic and evolutionary factors in the development of human behavior, reaching the conclusion that Free Will is just an illusion. Advances in neuroscience have shown that people become aware of the execution of an action several milliseconds after the brain has made the decision to execute it, which suggests that Free Will does not intervene.

In this complete interpretation and definition of Free Will, we Freemasons firmly believe in the existence of a Supreme Being and that we have not yet fully elucidated our destiny in order to understand who we are and where we are going.

THE POOL OF INFINITY: RIGHT ANGLES, HORIZONTALS, TRIADS, AND THE TRINITY

Brothers and Sisters, how great it is to experience the wonder and power of Creation! Standing in awe and amazement of the blazing heat of an Arizona summer, we can still find respite in the cool waters of a clean and refreshing swimming pool, whether we choose the shallow end or the deep. Submerged in that beautiful clear water for a short time, we find peace, refreshment, and a new calming perspective on the trajectory of the day. In this short essay, I invite you all to leave the heat behind and join me for a brief and refreshing metaphysical dip, exploring and pondering some thoughts on our sacred and glorious Science of Geometry. Join me here on the edge, and take my hand.

Take a deep breath, close your eyes, count to three, and prepare for that forward leap. Here we stand, you, I, and all else, on this beautiful plane of Substance and Material. Around us, in the beautiful light of day, stretches all of visible Creation to the horizon, in all directions. Above us, in a straight infinite line, our being touches the entire breadth of the Universe. Before us, under our feet, stretches the whole of our direction of travel, whether on this Earth, below the surface thereof, in the Air, of beneath the Waters. This right angle of Direction remains with us throughout the entirety of our lives, insofar as our forward progress provides it that second plane of existence. Worthy Friends, progression along the Horizontal is necessary, a perfect part of our mission on this physical plane; the progressive movement of your body and intellect propelling your soul towards perfection. But this movement is not solely for your own edification, for fellow Travelers walk beside you. Some of these travelers share your path for a time, then turn a corner and are gone. Some remain, traveling beside you to the end of Time. In all this, there are two truths that you must embrace and seek to act upon at all times. One, that you must acknowledge and accept the presence and guidance of the Divine, which dwells in the Infinity of the perpendicular Above and Two, that how you affect and effect your fellow Travelers on this horizontal level is of immense import to the progression of your Soul.

This conduit from the Divine and the spiritual to the Physical and mundane forms an angle of 90 degrees, or one-quarter of a full circle in its entirety.

Let us jump together into that beautiful water.

Kick your way to the surface, my friend, and take a deep, beautiful breath of Life-giving Air. Is it not amazing, this transition that you notice, the oppressive summer heat transforming by virtue of the cool water? We take a deep breath, relax, and sink again, our feet reaching the smooth and level surface below.

Opening our eyes on this level surface, we see surrounding us friends and family, equally, at first glance as serene and relaxed and carefree as we ourselves. But a second glance reveals more detail, and deeper insight. We see our loved ones truly; here stands one dealing with the dissolution of a relationship. There stands one, on the same plane as we, dealing silently with health and wellness issues beyond the comprehension of most. Here, a brother with a cognitive disability. There, a sister grieving the end of a hopeful pregnancy. Beyond them, brothers and sisters experiencing success beyond our current means; all together on this level surface, each role, condition, and position suspended in the same medium in which we ourselves reside. In this place, not only with our eyes but in the deepest places of our hearts, we see clearly the close-knit connection of Humankind, the equality and interconnection of the Human experience. Here on the Level, all Human Beings reside; of varying levels of intelligence, wealth, health, and ability — all worthy of respect and acknowledgement regardless of station. Here on the Level, our hands are naturally extended to our fellow travelers in continual brotherly love and acceptance; whether to congratulate, to console, or to uplift and aid.

This horizontal plane, stretching from West to East before us, and East to West again behind, forms an angle of 180 degrees, or one-half of a full circle in its entirety.

Rising again from the level bottom of the pool, we surface, open our eyes, and take a deep breath through our nose, floating below the warmth of the sun. Here we bask, our body and spirit cooled by the blue water below, yet warmed by the sunlit air above. Our selves, the cool water, the warmth of the air, three things separate yet co-existing in beautiful triune harmony.

In this moment, we realize something deep and intrinsic about our physiognomy. We naturally think of our bodies in terms of twos: two eyes, two ears, two arms and hands, and two legs and feet, etc. Two is a very human number; but we often disregard that each pair is offset by a third. supplemented by a nose that takes in scent, our ears that hear have a mouth before them that speaks; and our two arms and legs are both attached to a single trunk with all the organs of life within. These triads continue throughout our cardiopulmonary system, our nervous system, and our male and female reproductive systems, further into procreation itself; mother, father and child. We see these triads manifest in Masonic tradition, in the Three Pillars of the Lodge, the Jewels, the Degrees, and more.

Pondering further the mystery of creation, and of Life itself, our thoughts naturally turn to the Divine, to the Master of Creation, the prime mover, Architect and Progenitor of Mankind. Three is a divine number, the number of the Trinity: The Father, the Son, and the beautiful dove of the Holy Spirit, alighting upon and endowing Humanity with the indwelling of Divinity. Ancient philosophers envisioned this three-fold miracle in the form of a downward-facing equilateral triangle, descending and outpouring from Heaven in the blue light of spiritual awakening and reception, and merging with the red fire of creation in the form of an upwards-facing triangle composed of the body, soul and spirit of Mankind. This merging, this "marriage" as the ancient alchemists referred to it, took the form of the six-pointed star we know today as the Star of David and the Seal of King Solomon the Wise. This is a merging and emanation of the kind prophesied by the promise of the Hebrew name Emmanuel, or "God With Us", and beyond that, the Greek name, concept and story of Prometheus, who brought mankind that Fire of awakening, turning our eyes to those spiritual realms above. Thinking further, as we float between the fiery heat of the sun and the cool blue of the water, we come to realize an interesting correlation: with the addition of two horizontals, the Masonic symbol of the Square and Compasses becomes provocatively similar to the ancient Seal of King Solomon as well. But no, the degrees are off slightly, so we disregard this notion for now and swim on.

The interior angles of the equilateral triangle equal 60 and 60 and 60, forming a total of 180; but the addition of a second triangle gives us a total of 360 degrees, or a full circle in its entirety.

I'm feeling so peaceful and rejuvenated by this beautiful swim we've taken together! However, now is the time to emerge, take refreshment, reflect, and move forward with the evening. I know we will have amazing conversation and fellowship in the days to come; but for now...let's grab a towel and a drink, sit back, relax, reflect by this beautiful pool, and peacefully enjoy our glorious Arizona sunset.





I have always been intrigued by the symbolism in our Masonic orders. Listen today to see if you make any of the same connections to our Eastern Star symbolism as they relate to the patriotism of America.

Adah's sword and veil within the triangle are an emblem of her heroic conduct. Each person who has served in our military has been a symbol of heroism.

The Grand Lecturer's spear and open book within the star symbolize intelligence in preserving the rites, traditions, and ceremonies of Eastern Star. The inauguration or installation of officers each term, the traditions of each chapter and state that bind each other together, and the pomp and circumstance that make each ceremony unique are all a part of those rites, traditions, and ceremonies we hold dear. May we perform these duties with faithfulness and leadership.

The Conductress' scroll and baton within the star is an emblem of prepared plans and their fulfillment. It takes thoughtful minds to prepare plans to meet the goals of the greater good.

Ruth's symbol is a sheaf within the triangle, an emblem of plenty. I think of the many freedoms we have. As Americans, we have strong feelings about those freedoms. When those freedoms feel threatened or taken away, it is the symbol of the sheaf that reminds us to be faithful and that honor and justice will prevail.

The Warder's dove within the star is an emblem of peace, and the Sentinel's crossed swords within the star are an emblem of protection. We are so grateful for those who serve our country to keep the peace through protection.

The Associate Matron's symbol is the effulgent sun within the star, an emblem of light. Through the darkest times, Americans have shown that we can shine brightest through our gift of humanity.

Our Associate Patron's emblem is a star within the star, an emblem of divine guidance. So many call upon a higher power to seek council before making important decisions.

Esther's crown and scepter within the triangle are emblems of royalty and power. May we always ask what power we seek and to whom we are loyal.

Martha's broken column within the triangle is an emblem of a person cut off in the vigor of life. Countless have sacrificed their lives for us, not only in body but many in spirit as well. It is our freedom that we owe them our gratitude.

I can't think of any other place other than our Masonic family than the military that develops young recruits into leaders. The Associate Conductress' baton within the star is an emblem of leadership. Both organizations develop their members to be the best they can be if they are willing to invest their time and effort.

Electa's cup within the triangle is an emblem of charity and hospitality. United States Service members worldwide serve beyond their call of duty, just like we do to make this world a better place.

Thank goodness for the Organist's lyre within the star, an emblem of music and poetry. Each of us has a song in our heart, whether at our darkest time or in our happiest moment. Music unites us.

The Treasurer's crossed keys within the star are an emblem of security. By doing our jobs with the strictest fidelity and the utmost security, our country can be assured that we can meet our expenses and have enough to relieve those who are distressed.

The Chaplain's open bible within the star is an emblem of the Word of God. It reminds us to walk upright no matter what station in life we hold and that we can be the light to others in our cities, state, and country.

The Worthy Matron's gavel within the star is an emblem of authority making sure that her judgment and discretion are held accountable to a higher power. She, like all government officials, is looked to for wisdom, advice, forbearance, and counsel. The list of her duties are numerous, but the eyes of the chapter are upon her. (continued on next page)
